We will get all of the businesses up on the website, now that we have moved over to the new website. The Teacher totals are listed on the website so you can see your teachers total there.

C. Volunteer Needs (Ulrica Hammond, Volunteer Coordinator) - We need parents/ volunteers to sign up for Spin Art and Popcorn sales. I need a volunteer assistant to get the kids signed in that are volunteering for service hours. Cake walk we need volunteers to help get cakes donated or to make cakes. Kids pay \$10 to participate. Cake walk is like musical chairs. If you win,you get a cake. Ten kids, \$10 per round, 10 rounds makes \$100. We would like 10 total cakes. Dixon will head it up. They will play till they run out of cakes so if we get more than 10 cakes the better. We need someone to grill and a hotdog wrapper. Time shifts are split so you can have fun too. 5. Principal's Message (Mrs. Kashdin) I am so happy to see everyone present and online. Yesterday we concluded Open House. Powerpoint presentations are posted on our website if you missed them. Thank you Kindergarten social parents Marissa, Kristen and Corey for

making the connections. We will be together for 6 years. Thank you for making them feel welcome and they did an amazing job. Thank Mr. Alston for donating those items. Teachers will be super excited, they do not know yet. In grades K-2 -iready was replaced with another program but not for grades 3-5. Staff updates Mr. Barnes has joined us in the intermediate grades and Ms. Perez will be with the primary students. Ms Patty is working with a 5th grade student with a wheelchair. For Media, we hope she will begin next week so library books can start being checked out again. We currently have 483 students enrolled, we were projected to be at 496 students, because of the numbers we were unable to get another teacher to replace the resigning teacher, Ms. Osheroff. We had to shuffle some teachers around. Ferraro moved to 1st, Kurth to 5th. If you are involved I want to thank you for making the transition seamless for the students. This will balance our budget and the silver lining is that Ms. Hardison will get her classroom back. Harbordale has been chosen for a pilot program with Hazel Health. Hazel Health will now provide for parents to have telehealth appointments during school hours. There must be parental consent. This will be an additional consent form. It will start in October and more information will come home in the red folders. This can be very beneficial for some families. Question from Dr. Adrine McKenzie - Does this mean a student could see a Dr then return to class sick? Kashdin - No if the child has a headache the doctor can prescribe something like aspirin and the nurse can provide it. We can not administer anything like that to students. Kristy Quarles says it would be like if your child goes to the clinic because they think he/ she has pink eye, they can telehealth with the dr and the dr can prescribe something for it. You would pick up your child and get the prescription at your pharmacy instead of having to make another dr appointment. Everyone seemed very pleased with this. We are coming to the final days of the FAST Testing Progress Monitoring session 1. Last week was Reading. This week has been Math. Results will go home shortly after teachers review. December will be round 2, we will probably condense it to a week of testing because testing affects the whole school. Popcorn Fundraiser ends today, we are almost at the \$8,000 mark and we get 50%. Picture retakes will be on 9/30. If you want your child to retake the picture, please write a note that your child will participate and they can wear something other than their uniform. Food Forest Grant, Mr. Santos applied for this grant and got it for Harbordale. We will be setting up a garden behind the cafeteria where hopefully the iguanas will stay out of it. Installation day will be on Thursday, October 20th and Saturday, October 22nd. Great way for students to develop this into their curriculum. It will start with 2nd grade.

EVA - Excited about the food forest, we planned it out at the SAC meeting it was very exciting The fence covering should be delivered today and my husband could use some help putting it up. We are concluding this meeting and we kept it under an hour!
